

Ordinance No. 57

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PECK IDAHO, ADOPTING THE NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE, 1971 EDITION THEREOF, PROVIDING THAT THREE COPIES OF THE MANUAL AND AMENDMENTS THERETO WHALL BE ON FILE IN THE OFFICE OF THE CITY CLERK; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND FIXING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PECK, IDAHO:

Section 1. There is hereby adopted for the purpose of regulating and controlling all electrical ~~construction~~ construction within the City of Peck, Idaho the National Electrical Code, prepared by the National Fire Protection Association, and published by the same, 1971 edition, thereof and as the same may hereafter be revised or amended. And the same is hereby adopted and incorporated as an ordinance of the city as fully as though set forth at length herein.

Section 2. Three copies of the National Electrical Code, 1971 edition together with all amendments thereto, duly certified by the city clerk shall be kept on file in his office for the use and examination of and by the public.

Section 3. All ordinances of the City of Peck, Idaho, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from after its passage, approval and publication.

5-1-1: ADOPTION OF BUILDING CODE: There is hereby adopted for the purpose of establishing rules and regulations for the construction, alteration, removal, demolition, equipment, use and occupancy, location and maintenance of buildings and structures, that certain building code known as the Uniform Building Code, copyrighted by the International Conference of Building Officials, being particularly the 1961 Edition thereof, and the whole thereof, of which not less than three (3) copies have been and now are filed in the office of the Clerk, and the same is hereby adopted and incorporated as fully as if set out at length herein and the provisions thereof shall be controlling in the construction of all buildings and other structures.

5-1-2: FEES: Applicants for construction, repair or remodeling of any building shall pay to the Building Official, the following fees:

Less than \$20.00	No Fee
\$20.00 to and including \$100.00	\$1.00
More than \$100.00 to and including \$200.00	2.00
More than \$200.00 to and including \$400.00	3.00
More than \$400.00 to and including \$500.00	4.00
More than \$500.00 to and including \$600.00	5.00
More than \$600.00 to and including \$700.00	6.00
More than \$700.00 to and including \$800.00	7.00
More than \$800.00 to and including \$900.00	8.00
More than \$900.00 to and including \$1000.00	9.00
Each additional \$1000.00 or fraction, to and including \$15,000.00	2.00
Each additional \$1000.00 or fraction, to and including \$50,000.00	1.00
Each additional \$1000.00 or fraction, to exceed \$50,000.00	0.50

5-1-3: MOVING BUILDINGS: It shall be unlawful for any person to move any building along, over, or through any public place within the Corporate Limits without first having applied to and obtained from the building Inspector a permit so to do and without thereafter complying with all of the provisions of said permit and this Chapter.

5-1-4: PERMIT; APPLICATION: In order to obtain a permit, the applicant therefor shall file with the building Inspector an application in writing. Said application shall contain accurate statements of the kind and character of building it is proposed to move; its dimensions; the materials out of which it is constructed; the legal description of the premises upon which it is to be moved; a description of the route over which it is proposed to move the same; and a description of the means to be employed in moving such building.

5-1-5: BOND: Before a moving permit is granted the applicant shall deliver to the City a two thousand dollar(\$2000.00) cash or surety bond, to save and protect the City against any loss or damage it may sustain arising out of or incident to the moving of any building by the applicant.

5-1-6: NOTICE OF TIME OF MOVING: Whenever any person has secured a permit for moving under the provisions of this Chapter, he shall give to all public service corporations owning or operating public utilities along or across any of the streets included in the permit, written notice of the time when work of moving is to be commenced. Said notice shall be in writing and shall be served at least twenty-four (24) hours before the proposed time of commencing the moving.

5-1-7: DUTY OF PUBLIC SERVICE CORPORATIONS: Upon receipt of such notice it shall be the duty of such public service corporation to move, raise or otherwise dispose of its wires or other instrumentalities in such time and manner as will not cause delay to the holder of the permit, all of which shall be done at the expense of the applicant.

5-1-8: POLICE NOTIFIED BEFORE MOVING: Before any building is moved over or on any public street, the Police Department shall be notified and they shall direct the moving at a time and route designated by them.
