

**Call to Order:** Mayor Carson called meeting to order at 10:00 am on Tuesday, March 24, 2026.

**Employee Attendance:** Anthony Gravenmier (Back-up Water Operator), Leroy Kuykendall (Maintenance), Megan Weikle (Clerk/Treasurer)

**Pledge of Allegiance:** lead by Council President Milt Nodacker

**Roll Call and Conflict of Interest:** Council President Milt Nodacker, Councilmembers Tammy Hassell, Bennie Gockley, and Mayor Cheryl Carson were all present with no conflicts of interest. Councilmember Rob Milchak was absent.

1. **Read Ordinance No. 189 by Title Only:** Megan Weikle read Ordinance No. 189 by title only.
2. **Discuss Ordinance to Clarify Parking on City Property/City Streets:** Mayor Carson explained that the City of Pierce made their ordinance regarding parking and derelict vehicles available to the City of Peck. She shared a draft of an ordinance that she has been working on. Discussion began regarding citizens who are parking vehicles and sometimes abandoning them on City property. Comments were made about difficulties that arise when private property encroaches upon City property, especially in emergencies. Mayor Carson explained that she has tried encouraging citizens to cooperate with City ordinances and policy, but that improvements are not being made.

Council broke for a recess at 10:19.

Council reconvened at 10:24.

Conversation turned to the definition of a “business” and the importance that this would have in the wording of the ordinance. Mayor Carson shared Ordinance No. 49, which is an adoption of Idaho Code Title 49. Tammy Hassell proposed that if the City of Peck has already adopted Title 49, there may be no reason to write a new ordinance. Megan suggested comparing Title 49 to Pierce’s ordinance in order to see if there’s anything else that could be added. Milt Nodacker suggested a town hall meeting to give citizens an opportunity to understand that enforcement of ordinances will be happening with more regularity than in the past. Mayor Carson proposed that deciding on a date for the town hall meeting should go on the next City Council agenda. She also proposed that notices about Ordinance No. 49 be included in the next water bill.

3. **Discuss Proposed Ordinance 190: Renaming May Street:** Tammy Hassell acknowledged that the notice asking for suggestions for renaming May Street had not been posted and would make that happen as soon as possible. Milt Nodacker suggested and Mayor Carson agreed that the post should state that unless citizens want to make name suggestions, May Street will be renamed Orchard Street.
4. **Discuss Solution for Extraordinary Garbage Piles:** Leroy provided photos of properties within City limits that contain refuse piles that are potentially hazardous to surrounding areas. Megan provided the council with a copy of a letter she had sent to a citizen who is in violation of City Ordinance 52, which makes accumulation of garbage unlawful. Mayor Carson proposed that if no action is taken by the citizen by 4/1/2026, another letter should be sent, giving the citizen a deadline and then asking Nez Perce County to step in.
5. **Discuss Peck City Festival:** Megan asked if a date has been set for the festival and Mayor Carson responded that it would be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in August, which is August 22, 2026. Mayor Carson expressed a desire for donations in order to have an auction to raise money for the Peck Community Center repairs. Megan suggested sending festival flyers to other city clerks in the area to drum up interest.




